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










P R E F A C E.

" What is most International is nearest the Ideal."

In publishing this Dictionary of the Neutral Language, something must be premised as to the origin of the latter, for very few are aware that there exists a well organized international society, to which the language owes its origin.

After many fruitless attempts — and all by eminent scholars — had been made in the course of the last three hundred years to construct an artificial language that would serve to facilitate intercourse between persons of different nationalities, in the year 1879 Rev. J. M. Schleyer of Litzelstetten, Baden, succeeded in excogitating such a language, called Volapük, which at the time attracted general notice, since the grammar of this language, in contradistinction to the difficult grammars of the living languages, is surprisingly simple ; in a few hours the rules could be acquired and correspondence immediately entered upon with the aid of a dictionary.

This simplicity caused many to learn the interesting language, and after a few years Volapük was so widely spread that there were hundreds of Volapük clubs, and over twenty Volapük papers were published.

Soon, however, complaints arose as to certain imperfections of the language : some Volapükists arbitrarily introduced changes

corrections, which were not recognized by others, among them the inventor ; disagreements arose, and in consequence it was universally deemed desirable to call into existence a society which would preserve the unity of the language and perfect Volapük.

Such a society, under the name of International Academy of the Universal Language, was founded by the Volapük congress, held in Munich in the year 1887, and the statutes of this Academy were ratified by the international Volapük congress held in Paris in the year 1889 ; by which statutes the Academy is to this day guided. At first seventeen persons, from twelve different countries, were chosen to constitute the Academy ; later the number of members fluctuated between fifteen and thirty-six. The labors of the Academy could be carried on only in writing, since the members lived in various localities (in Europe, America, Africa and Asia).

In the beginning the Academy was occupied with the discussion of grammatical questions ; later, when it was seen that very many words are common to most European languages and consequently are already familiar to those speaking a European langage, e. g. *tenor*, *plan*, *basin*, *brutal*, and that therefore all these world-words must find favor in a language intended for international communication, the Volapük words, which are to a great extent taken from the English, but often so distorted as to be unrecognizable, were replaced by international words.


Now, as the result of the labors of the Academy, a language has arisen—called Neutral Language (Idiom Neutral),—which has retained the good qualities of Volapük, but differs essentially from Volapük in this, that it consists almost exclusively of international words, and can thus, whether spoken or written, be understood by every educated man almost without any previous study.

Consequently the Neutral Language is capable of rendering effective service in all cases where persons of different nationalities

must make themselves understood either orally or in writing, whether it be for commercial, scientific, or other purposes ; in a word, wherever the need of a so-called universal language exists.

GRAMMAR
OF THE
NEUTRAL LANGUAGE
(IDIOM NEUTRAL).

I. Pronunciation and Orthography.

§ 1. The Neutral Language (Idiom neutral) has 22 letters, 5 vowels : **a e i o u**, and 17 consonants : **b c d f g h j k l m n p r s t v y**.

The vowels are pronounced as follows :
a as **a** in the English word far, father, guard.
e " **a** " " " cape, dale, fate.
i " **e** " " " me.
o " **o** " " " no, note.
u " **u** " " " truth, or
oo " " " " moon, room.

Consecutive vowels are pronounced separately, e. g. **hebre-ik** Hebraic, **a-utomat** automaton, **E-urop** Europe, **no-l** we, **si-e** his.

The consonants are always pronounced as follows :
b as **b** in the English word bar.
c " **ch** " " " chain, charity. (r. 115, r. 126) (*)
d " **d** " " " date.
f " **f** " " " fate.
g " **g** " " " get, give, got. (**)

(*) The figures after the "r." denote the number of the respective resolution of the Academy.

(**) Never as in the English word gentle.

h as **h** in the English word hold. (r. 119).

j " **z** " " " " " azure, seizure, or

j " **j** " " French word Jean, je, jour. (r. 110).

k " **k** " " English keep, kill.

l " **l** " " " late, let.

m " **m** " " " mat, met.

n " **n** " " " not, note.

p " **p** " " " pale, pair.

r " **r** " " " rain, red.

s " **s** " " " sale, seal, sill (*) (r. 118).

t " **t** " " " tale, till.

v " **v** " " " vale, vague.

y " **y** " " " yet, yoke. (r. 112).

The letters **s** and **h**, if they stand together, form an exception hereto; they are then pronounced as **sh** in the English word "shall." (r. 109).

REMARK. In the phonetic writing of proper names and foreign words, in order to show their pronunciation, the following letters and combinations of letters may be used (r. 116, r. 117):

1. **ä** for the sound **ä** in the German language=**aï** in the English word fair.
 2. **ö** for the sound **ö** in the German language=**o** in the English word word.
 3. **ü** for the sound **ü** in the German language=**u** in the French word une.
 4. **z** for the sound **z** in the English word zeal, zinc.
 5. **gh** for the sound **g** in the Danish language, e. g. in the word sag.
 6. **kh** for the sound **ch** in the German language, e. g. in the word Sache.
 7. **th** for the sound **th** in the English language, e. g. in the word Bath.
- § 2. Words are **accented** according to the following rule (r. 57):

The accent (or stress of voice) is on the vowel that immediately precedes the last consonant, if there be such vowel, e. g. **fortun** (pronounced **fortún**) fortune, **manu** (pr. **mánu**) hand, **aloe** (pr.

(*) Never as **s** in the English word rose; in other words, **s** of idiom *neutral* is always voiceless, never voiced.

aloe) aloe, **filio** (pr. **fillo**) son ; otherwise it is on the first vowel, e. g. **mai** (pr. **máí**) May, **Deo** (pr. **Déo**) God. In exceptional cases the accented (stressed) vowel is denoted by a written accent, e. g. **Idé** idea, **alé** alley, **depó** depot.

REMARK. In the compounding of such words, that is words having the written accent, with a suffix, the accent is dropped and the word is accented (stressed) according to the general rule, e. g. **aleatr** (pronunciation **aleatr**) alley-like.

II. The Substantive.

§ 3. The Neutral Language has only one declension for all substantives (r. 43-47) :

SINGULAR.

- Nominative : **dom** ; the or a house.
- Genitive : **de dom** ; of the or a house.
- Dative : **a dom** ; to the or a house.
- Accusative : **dom** ; the or a house.

PLURAL.

- Nominative : **domi** ; the houses.
- Genitive : **de domi** ; of the houses.
- Dative : **a domi** ; to the houses.
- Accusative : **domi** ; the houses.

The **accusative** is distinguished from the nominative by its place in the sentence : the nominative stands before the verb, the accusative after the verb, e. g. **mi klos porta**, I lock the door ; **patr puni filio**, the father punishes the son. (r. 46).

The **dative** can be used also without the preposition **a**, and in that case it is indicated by a fixed place in the sentence, namely before the accusative ; this applies particularly to pronouns, e. g. **Il donav mi libr**, he gave me a book ; **Il mit mi flori**, he sends me flowers. (r. 55).

§ 4. There is no **article** ; accordingly the English articles **the** and **a**, **an** are not translated, and conversely the word **dom** can mean *the house* as well as *a house* ; which meaning is to be taken can be almost always determined from the context.—If the word **a** stands for **a certain**, it is translated by **sert** : **sert dom**, a house,

a certain house ; but if it stands for **some**, **any**, it is translated by **kelkun** : **kelkun dom**, a house, some house. If we wish to refer to a definite object, the demonstrative pronouns can be used : **ist dom**, this house ; **el dom**, that house. (c. 42/44) (*)

§ 5. Nouns are (1) of the **mascuine** gender, if they denote persons or animals of the male sex, (2) of the **feminine** gender, if they denote persons or animals of the female sex, and (3) of the **neuter** gender in all other cases.—Mascuine nouns are formed by the addition of the suffix **-o**, e. g. **kavalō** stallion, **ansianō** old man,—and feminine nouns by the addition of the suffix **-a**, e. g. **kavala** mare, **italiana** an Italian (woman) (**). (r. 34, 35. Cf. r. 122 d).

§ 6. **Diminutives** are formed by the addition of the suffix **-et**, e. g. **sigaret** cigarette, **kavalet** pony, **filleta** little daughter. (r. 103).

§ 7. Designations for **not full-grown** (young) animals are formed by compounds with the word **yun** young, e. g. **yun-kaval** colt, **yun-ran** tadpole. (r. 86, c. 53/56).

III. The Adjective.

§ 8. Adjectives are distinguished as primitive, e. g. **grand** great, **fasil** easy,—and derivative, which are formed from other parts of speech by the addition of one of the seven suffixes **-abl**, **-al**, **-an**, **-atr**, **-id**, **-ik**, **-os**. (r. 12).

Adjectives in **-abl** show that something is possible or worthy, with a passive meaning ; this suffix is used principally with verbal roots, e. g. **komprendabl** comprehensible, intelligible, **konvenabl** suitable, fitting. (r. 49).

The suffix **-al** is used instead of the suffix **-ik** (see below), if the root ends in **-ik**, e. g. **gramatikal** grammatical, **teknikal** technical. (r. 133).

Adjectives in **-an** show appurtenance to some one or something, e. g. **mahometan** Mahometan, **amerikan** American. (r. 32).

(*) The figures after the "c." denote the numbers of the circulars of the Director of the Academy to the members thereof, (1) of the circular in which the respective words were proposed, (2) of the circular in which the Director announced the acceptance of these words on the part of the Academy.

(**) The meaning of the roots **kaval**, **ansian**, etc., can easily be found *in the dictionary* ; it is therefore not repeated here.

Adjectives in **-atr** indicate similarity or likeness; this suffix can be joined to substantive and adjective roots, e. g. **petratr** stone-like, petrous, **verdatr** greenish. (r. 50).

REMARK. If words end in **a**, the suffixes **-abl**, **-an**, **-atr** are changed into **-bl**, **-n**, **-tr**, e. g. **rusian** Russian, **akuatr** watery. (r. 49, 32, 50).

Adjectives in **-id** show a quality of some one or of something; this suffix is used with verbal roots, e. g. **timid** timid, **splendid** splendid, bright. (r. 135).

Adjectives in **-os** indicate a fullness or multitude of anything, e.g. **petros** stony, **oleos** oily, **lanos** woolly, **amoros** amorous. (r. 33).

The suffix **-ik** is the general adjective suffix; it indicates quality and is used to form derivative adjectives, for which the remaining suffixes, **-abl**, **-an**, **-atr**, **-id**, **-os**, are not suitable because of their special signification, e. g. **elektrik** electric, **rusik** Russian, **anuik** annual, **Atlantik** Atlantic, **fantastik** fantastic, **galvanik** galvanic, **hastik** hasty, **historik** historic, **homik** human, **horisontik** horizontal, **idealik** ideal, **Identik** identical, **lanik** woolen, etc. (r. 31, 139).

§ 9. **Comparison** takes place by putting before the adjective the adverbs **plu**, for the comparative, and **leplu** for the superlative, e. g. **plu grand** greater, **leplu grand** greatest. (r. 123).

The conjunction **than** after the comparative is translated by **ka**, e. g. **vo es plu grand ka mi**, you are taller than I. **So-as**, **as-as**, are rendered by **tale—kuale**, e. g. **vo es tale grand kuale mi**, you are as tall as I. (c. 42/44).

The adverb **very** is translated by **multe**, e. g. **multe grand** very great. (c. 42/44).

§ 10. The adjective always follows the substantive to which it belongs, e. g. **dom grand** the large house, **lingu universal** the universal language (r. 84)—and is never varied, e. g. **patr bon** the good father, **filla bon** the good daughter, **filli bon** the good children. (Gl. n.) (*)

§ 11. Every adjective can be used as a substantive, and is then declined as a substantive, e. g. **boni e mali** the good and the bad, **poltron** cowardly, a coward. (r. 132).

(*) The letters Gl. n. signify that the rule in question is quoted from the **Glamat nomik** (Normal Grammar), written in Volapük, which was duly accepted by the Academy and published in the year 1892; which rule has not been changed by any subsequent resolution of the Academy.

§ 12. It is not allowed to form a verb from an adjective by means of the general verbal suffixes, but, for the sake of clearness, either the verb **esar** to be, or one of the suffixes, **-ifikar** or **-eskár**, is to be used, e. g. **esar san** to be well (healthy), **sanifikar** to heal, **saneskar** to recover, to convalesce. (r. 121).

IV. The Numeral.

§ 13. **Cardinal Numbers** [which answer the question **kuant?** how many?] are either roots, e. g. 1 **un**, 2 **du**, 3 **tri**, 10 **des**,—or compound words, e. g. 20 **du-des**, 34 **tri-des-kuatr**.

The following are roots : 1 **un**, 2 **du**, 3 **tri**, 4 **kuatr**, 5 **kuink**, 6 **seks**, 7 **sept**, 8 **okt**, 9 **nov**, 0 **nul**, 10 **des**, 100 **sent**, 1,000 **mil**, 1,000,000 **million**, 1,000,000,000 **billion**, 1,000,000,000,000 **trillion**, 1,000,000,000,000,000 **kuadrillion**, 1,000,000,000,000,000,000 **kuintillion**.—The rest are formed from these by composition, **des** with other numerals being always combined into one word, **sent**, on the contrary, only when another numeral precedes; the higher numerals, **mil**, **million**, **billion**, etc., always stand alone, e. g.

§ 14.	The ordinal numbers [which answer the question kuantim? which of the number? what number? which? what? (what-th, if there were such word)] are formed from the cardinal numbers by the addition of the suffix -lm to the respective cardinal	

number, and to the last word of the cardinal, e. g. 1. **unim** first, 2. **duim** second, 7. **septim** seventh, 12. **desduim** twelfth, 30. **tridesim** thirtieth, 100. **sentim** hundredth, 120. **sent dudesim** hundred and twentieth, 325. **trisent dudeskuinkim** three hundred and twenty-fifth, 1000. **millim** thousandth, etc., but it is allowed to use instead of the derived forms the following seven well-known roots: 1. **prim** first, 2. **sekund** second, 3. **ters** third, 4. **kuart** fourth, 5. **kuint** fifth, 6. **sekst** sixth, and 8. **oktav** eighth.—It is also permitted to use the cardinals instead of the ordinals, if the sense shows that there is no question of a cardinal; but in this case the cardinal must occupy the same place in the sentence that the ordinal would, if they were used, namely after the substantive (see below, § 19), e. g. **z des § 10, pagin trisent dudeskuink** page 325. (r. 81).

§ 15. **Multiplicatives** [which answer the question **kuantupl?** how many fold?] are formed by the addition of the suffix **-upl** to the respective cardinal number, and to the last word of the cardinal, e. g. 1. **unupl** simple, 2. **duupl** double, twofold, 3. **triuupl** threefold, triple, treble, 105. **sent kuinkupl** hundred and fivefold, etc., but it is allowed to use instead of the derived forms the following three well-known roots: 1. **simpl** simple, 2. **dupl** double, twofold, 3. **tripl** threefold, triple, treble. (r. 82).

REMARK. The suffix **-upl** is used also with the word **mult** many: **multupl** manifold, multiple. (r. 82).

§ 16. The **distributives** [which answer the question **a kuant?** how many apiece? each how many? by how many?] are formed by placing the preposition **a** before the respective cardinal number, e. g. **a un** one apiece, one each, one by one, **a du** two apiece, two each, two by two etc. (c. 20, 28, 42-44).

§ 17. The **iteratives** [which answer the question **kuantfoa?** how many times? and **kuantlimfoa?** for the which time? for the what (what-th; see § 14) time? for the how many-th (? time?) are formed by the addition of the suffix **-foa** to the respective cardinal or ordinal, and to the last word of the cardinal or ordinal, e. g. 1. **unfoa** once, 2. **dufoa** twice, 100. **sentfoa** a hundred times, 1. **primfoa** for the first time, 139. **sent tridesnovimfoa** for the one hundred and thirty-ninth time, etc. (r. 83).

REMARK. The suffix **-foa** can be used also with other parts of speech, e. g. **multfoa** many times, **ultimfoa** for the last time, etc. (r. 83).

§ 18. **Fractions** are formed by a cardinal (for the numerator) with an ordinal (for the denominator) following **v**, e. g. **v₂** **v₃**

sekund or **un demi**, $\frac{1}{2}$ **du tersi**, 0.2 **du desimi**, 0.03 **tri sentimi**, $\frac{1}{6.9}$ **du unsent novimi**, 0.007 **sept millimi**. If a fraction is used with a whole number, the fraction is joined to the whole number by the conjunction **e**, e. g. $3\frac{1}{4}$ **tri e un kuart**, $\pi = 3.14159 \dots$ **tri totali e un kuatr un kuink nov e s.**, 0.145 ... **nul totali e un kuatr kuink e s.** (r. 85).

§ 19. Cardinal numbers and fractions always precede the substantive to which they belong, e. g. **du kaval** two horses, **tri kuarti metr** $\frac{3}{4}$ meter;—the remaining numerals always follow the substantive or verb to which they belong, e. g. **paragraf sekund** § 2, **plesir dupl** double pleasure, **nol andav a du** we went by twos, **mi klamar trifoa** I shouted three times. (r. 84).

§ 20. **Numeral adverbs** are formed by adding the adverbial suffix **-e** to the respective ordinal, e. g. 1. **prime** first, 2. **sekunde** secondly, etc. (c. 29/33).

§ 21. **Numeral verbs** are formed by the addition of the suffix **-ifikar** to multiplicatives, e. g. **simplifikar** to simplify, **duplifikas** to double, etc. (r. 52).

§ 22. **Dating** takes place in the following manner: **in diurn tridesim de mens yull de anu mil novsentini** pò nat de Krist, which, by the omission of the words printed in ordinary roman, and even of the word **In**, is usually shortened to: **tridesim yull, mil novsent** 30 July, 1900.

The twelve months of the year are called: **yanuar, februar, mars, april, mai, yuni, yull, august, septembr, oktobr, novembr, desembr**.

The seven days of the week are called: **soldi, lundi, marsdi, merkurdi, yovdi, vendrdi, saturndi**. (r. 100).

§ 23. The time of day is expressed in the following manner: [it es] **hor tri e un kuart**, it is quarter after three o'clock: **hor tri e des minutli**, ten minutes after three; **hor tri e kuinkdes-kuatr [minutli]**, six minutes to four; **in hor septim de matin**, between six and seven o'clock in the morning.

V. The Pronoun.

§ 24. **The Personal Pronoun.** (r. 122).

SINGULAR.

1st Person :	mi , I.
2d " "	vo , you.
3d " "	ll , he. lla , she. lt , it.
	on, one, they, people.

The reflexive pronoun is **se**, self.

§ 25. If only one person is addressed, the pronoun is always in the singular, namely **vo**.

REMARK. There is also another pronoun for the second person singular, namely **tu**; but it is used only for a literal translation of the word **thou**, if such translation is absolutely necessary. (r. 79).

§ 26. The pronouns **ll**, **lla**, **lt** are employed according to the following rule : **ll** is used if we speak of persons or animals without distinction of sex, or of male persons or animals ; **lla**—if we speak of female persons or animals ; **lt**—if we speak of notions signifying neither persons nor animals.—**llai** is used only if there is special question of female persons or animals ; in all other cases the plural form is **lli**. (r. 122).

§ 27. The pronoun **lt** with an adjective or participle following is used to express the indefinite, e. g. **lt bel** the beautiful, **lt bon** the good, **lt lekted** the read (what has been read). (r. 122).

§ 28. Personal pronouns (also other words) can be made emphatic by the addition of the pronoun **aut** self, e. g. **mi aut I** myself, **vo aut** you yourself, **direktor aut** the director himself. (r. 122).

§ 29. The personal pronouns (as also all other pronouns used as substantives) are declined by placing the preposition **de** (for the genitive) and **a** (for the dative) before them, e. g. **mi I**, **de mi** of me, **a mi** to me, **ml me**; **voI** you, **de voI** of you, **a voi** to you, **voI** you. (r. 122).

§ 30. THE POSSESSIVE PRONOUN.

1st Person :	mie , my, mine.	nostr , our, ours.
2d " "	votr , your, yours.	vostr , your, yours.
3d " "	sie , his, her, hers, its.	lor , their, theirs.

The reflexive possessive pronoun is **sue** his (own), her (own), its (own), their (own). It is used instead of **sle** and **lor**, if it re-

lates to the subject of the sentence in which it stands. (c. 31/36).

The possessive pronoun **tue** corresponds to the personal pronoun **tu.** (r. 79).

§ 31. The possessives, and in general all pronouns that relate to a substantive, are always placed before the respective substantive, e. g. **mie dom** my house, **ist sirkular** this circular, **kel tabl?** which table? **kuant homi?** how many men (human beings)? **kelk paroli** some words, **omni lingui** all languages. (r. 84).

§ 32. THE DEMONSTRATIVE PRONOUN.

ist , this.	ist-kos , this (thing).
el , that.	el-kos , that (thing).
tel , that, the one.	tel-kos , that (neuter).

el sem, the same.

yuste el sem, just the same.

it sem, the same thing.

yuste it sem, just the same thing.

In case the pronouns **ist** and **el** are used as substantives, they may take the masculine suffix **-o** and the feminine **-a**, if we wish to specify particularly the sex of the persons or animals spoken of, e. g. **ista, elo.** (c. 42/44, 46/48, r. 122).

ist-kos, el-kos, tel-kos, it sem and **yuste it sem** can be used only substantively.

§ 33. THE INTERROGATIVE AND, EQUALLY, RELATIVE PRONOUNS.

ki? who?	kel? who? which? what? that?
kekos? what? which?	

The pronoun **ki** is used for persons and **kekos** for all other notions. (r. 122).

These pronouns are declined like substantives by means of the prepositions **de** and **a**, and **kel** takes in the plural the suffix **-i:kel*i*.** If it should be necessary to indicate the sex of the person or animals spoken of, **kel** may take the endings **-o** and **-a**, e. g. **matr de ist sinlor, kela venlav a ml,** the mother of this gen' man, who (the mother) came to me.

The pronoun **kel** may also be used adjectively, in which it remains unchanged, e. g. **kel sinlor es votr fratr?** which tleman is your brother? **kel sinlora es votr matr?** which la your mother?—The remaining interrogative and relative pro- can be used only substantively. (c. 42/44).

§ 34. THE INDEFINITE PRONOUNS.

The pronouns **otr** and **sert** can take the adverbial suffix **-e**, in which case they mean : **otre** otherwise, else; **serte** certainly, surely. (c. 27/32, 42/44).

VI. The Verb.

§ 36. **Idiom neutral** has only one conjugation for all verbs ; there are six tenses : present, imperfect, perfect, pluperfect, future, and future perfect.

§ 37. The **present active** is formed from the simple root of the verb, and is recognized by the place that the verb occupies in

the sentence, namely after the subject, e. g. **mi am** I love, **infant dorm** the child sleeps. (r. 61).

The form of the present, as also of all other tenses of the indicative and conditional, is independent of the gender, grammatical person, and number of the subject, that is, it always remains unchanged, (r. 59) e. g.

mi am , I love.	noi am , we love.
vo am , you love.	voi am , you love.
il am , he loves.	ili am , they love.
ila am , she loves.	liai am , they love.
it am , it loves.	on am , one loves.

§ 38. The **imperfect** is formed by adding the suffix **-av** to the root, (r. 87) e. g.

mi amav, I loved ;
the **future**, by adding the suffix **-ero**, (r. 88) e. g.
mi amero, I shall love.

§ 39. In the same way the present, imperfect, and future of all other verbs are formed, including **avar**, to have, and **esar**, to be, which are used as auxiliaries in forming other tenses, thus :

mi av , I have.	mi avero , I shall have.

The **passive participle**, which is used also in forming some other tenses, always ends in **-ed**, (r. 94) e. g.
amed, loved. **aved**, had. **esed**, been.

§ 40. The **perfect**, **pluperfect**, and **future perfect** active (r. 95) are formed by means of the auxiliary verb **avar** and the passive participle of the respective verb ; thus there is employed for the formation of the

- (a) **perfect** the present of **avar**, e. g. **mi av amed**, I have loved.
- (b) **pluperfect** the imperfect of **avar**, e. g. **mi avav amed**, I had loved.
- (c) **future perfect** the future of **avar**, e. g. **mi avero amed**, I shall have loved.

§ 41. The **present conditional** is formed by adding the suffix **-erio** to the root, e. g.

mi amerio, I should love. (r. 96).

§ 42. The **past conditional** is formed by using the present conditional of the auxiliary verb **avar** and the passive participle of the respective verb, e. g.

mi averio amed, I should have loved. (r. 73).

§ 43. The **subjunctive** has the same form as the conditional and is used in conditional secondary propositions with the conjunction **If**, if the condition expressed is considered as not having happened or as not actual, e. g. **mi akuirerlo dom**, if **mi eserio rik**, I should buy a house, if I were rich.

REMARK. In secondary propositions with the conjunction **ke**, that, the indicative, not the subjunctive, is used, e. g. **on dik**, **ke il es malad**, they say that he is sick or they say he is sick ; (r. 74) the conjunction **ke**, that, is never omitted, though it may be in English.

§ 44. The **imperative** is formed by the addition of the following suffixes to the root of the verb :

(a) for the 2d pers. sing. **-a**, e. g. **ama!** love you !

(b) for the 2d pers. plur. **-ate**, e. g. **amate!** love ye !

(c) for the 1st pers. plur. **-am**, e. g. **aman!** let us love !

For the third person the conjunction **ke**, that, is used, e. g. [**mi komand**, mi demand, **mi desir**] **ke il (li) am!** let him (them) love ! **ke nostr patria viv!** long live our native land ! (r. 75).

§ 45. The general **infinitive** suffix is **-ar**, e. g.

amar, to love. (r. 36).

§ 46. If the sense positively requires that past time be indicated (which is very seldom), the **past Infinitive** may be formed by the suffix **-avar** or by the infinitive of the auxiliary verb **avar** with the passive participle of the respective verb, e. g. **amavar** or **avar amed**, to have loved. (r. 91).—The **future infinitive** (a still rarer form) is formed by the suffix **-erar**, e. g. **amerar**, to be about to love. (r. 92).

§ 47. The general suffix for the **active participle** is **-ant**, e. g. **amant**, loving. (r. 58).

§ 48. The **past participle** is formed by means of the suffix **-avant** or by the participle of the verb **avar** with the passive participle of the respective verb, e. g.

amavant or **avant amed**, having loved. (r. 89).

The **future participle** is formed by means of the suffix **-erant**, e. g.

amerant, being about to love. (r. 90).

§ 49. The participial adverb is obtained by adding the adverbial suffix **-e** to the participle, e. g.

amante, lovingly; **ridante**, laughingly. (r. 58).

§ 50. The **indicative**, **conditional**, **imperative** and **infinitive passive** are formed by means of the active of the auxiliary verb **esar**, to be, and the passive participle of the respective verb, e. g.

§ 54. In **impersonal verbs** the pronoun **it**, it, is used as subject e. g. **it pluvi**, it rains. (r. 78).

§ 55. **Reflexive verbs** are conjugated according to the following rules : (r. 98)

(a) For the first and second person singular and plural of the active, conditional and imperative a personal pronoun [**mi**, **vo**, **voi**] corresponding to the subject is used after the verb, e. g.

(r. 84).

REMARK. Complements of time, place and reason may be placed before the verb, if they are of special importance, e. g. **nokuande mi skribav tale** never did I write so, **in ist dom Emerson morlav** in this house Emerson died, **kausu pluvi noi restero dom** because of the rain we shall remain at home. (Gl. n.).

XI. Formation of Words.

§ 71. Words are distinguished into primitives (otherwise known as radicals), e. g. **tabl** table, derivatives, e. g. *nemult* few, **drogist** druggist, and compound words, e. g. **grand-patr** grandfather.

(a) PRIMITIVES.

§ 72. Radicals are taken from the Aryan languages. The "International Academy of the Universal Language" has laid down the following rule for the selection of radicals: "That word is most suitable for an international language, which already exists as a national word or as a foreign word in the most of the leading languages of Europe." (r. 11). In this the following seven languages were especially considered: English (e), French (f), German (d) [from the first letter of the word: deutsch], Spanish (s), Italian (l), Russian (r) and Latin (l), and, wherever practicable, such words were chosen as occur in all seven languages, e. g. **apetit**, **e f d s i r l**, appetite; **diametr**, **e f d s i r l**, diameter; **eksaminar**, **e f d s i r l**, to examine; **tri**, **e f d s i r l**, three, etc. This work of the Academy has shown that there are very many words which are already international, — many more than is generally believed. The most of the radicals chosen occur in at least four of the above-mentioned leading languages; only exceptionally had roots to be taken, that are common to fewer than four of these languages, e. g. **trotoar**, **f d r**, sidewalk; **urs**, **f l l**, bear; **tint**, **d s**, ink. For those notions for which there are no international words, derivatives or compounds (see below) were given the preference over words of the natural languages; thus were formed, for instance, words such as *nemult*, (*few; **kanalet**, ditch, trench; **saneskar**, to convalesce; **bel-fillo**, son-in-law.

§ 73. In order to bring the pronunciation into agreement with the orthography, that is, in order to obtain a really simple, easily acquired orthography, it was resolved to write:

1. **ku**, where **qu** appears in the national word, e. g. **kuadrat** quadrat, square. (r. 120).

2. that **c** before consonants and before **a**, **o**, **u** is, in accordance with general pronunciation, replaced by **k**, e. g. **kart** card, **klas** class, **kolor** color, **kub** cube; and before **e** and **i** by **s**, e. g. **selebr** celebrated, **sipres** cypress. (r. 23).

(*) The meaning of the separate parts of words can be easily looked up in the dictionary; they are therefore not repeated here.

3. that **t** in the ending **-tion** is, in accordance with the pronunciation, replaced by **s**, (*) e. g. **nasion** nation. (r. 23).
4. if a word occurs in English, French and German, but with different endings, e. g. Anker **d**, anchor **e**, ancre **f**;—Meter **d**, meter **e**, mètre **f**; Bibel **d**, Bible **e f**,—two or three consonants may be written consecutively at the end, e. g. **ankr**, **metr**, **bibl**, because the insertion of a vowel, for instance **e**, before the final consonant would, according to the general rule for accentuation, cause an unnatural accentuation, e. g. **bibél**, and on the other hand the writing of a meaningless vowel at the end of a word is useless. (r. 23).
5. that **z** of the national languages is replaced by **s**, (*) e. g. **basar** bazaar, **mäarket**. (r. 23).
6. **ph** is replaced by **f**, e. g. **fosfor** phosphorus. (r. 23).
7. **x** is replaced by **ks**, e. g. **eksaminar** to examine. (Gl. n., c. 23/28).
8. if for the same meaning different roots are extant, e. g. **vid** and **vis**, **redig** and **redakt**, **kresk** **krev** and **kret**, **kolig** and **kolekt**, that root was chosen which is the better known, the more general, e. g. **visar** to see, **redaktar** to edit, **kreskar** to grow, **kolektar** to collect (r. 23).
9. in some cases roots having the same form but different meanings were admitted, but only when they belong to different parts of speech, e. g. **dur** hard, **durar** to last; **llbr** book, **llbr** free; **nov** new, **nov** nine. (r. 23).
10. **ae** and **oe** of Latin words were replaced by **e**, e. g. **diet** diet, **homeopati** homeopathy. (r. 23).
11. **ch** of Greek words was replaced by **k**, e. g. **kerub** cherub, **Krist** Christ. (r. 23).
12. double consonants of the national languages were replaced by simple, e. g. **aprender** to learn, **erar** to err, **suposar** to suppose, because double consonants possess merely a historical, and no practical, value, and at the same time are by no means international, e. g. **adresse f d**, address **e**. (r. 23).
13. that **j** of Latin words was replaced by **y**, e. g. **yug** yoke, **obyekt** object; **mayestet** majesty. (r. 23, 112).
14. **g** (before **e** and **i**) and **j** in words of French origin are written **J** and pronounced like the French **j** (the sound of **z** in the

English words **azure**, **seizure**, e. g. **jalus** jealous, **kurtaj** brokerage. (r. 110).

15. the sound **sh** was written **sh**, e. g. **shalup** sloop, **sharm** charm. (r. 109).

16. in the endings **-lon**, **-ler** I was written, e. g. **nasion** nation, **kavalier** knight. (r. 113).

17. in words which in French contain **ll** and **gn** liquid, an **I** was written after **l** and **n**, e. g. **billet** billet, **vinlet** vignette. (r. 114).

18. it was resolved to use : (a) no consonants with any distinctive mark, e. g. **c** with a cedilla as in French, (b) no inverted letters, e. g. **ß**, such as phonetic societies make use of. (r. 108).

These rules served in general for guidance, but the Academy did not deem them binding in every instance, and examined each particular root as to its form and meaning. (r. 24).

§ 74. All words that, in any respect, do not agree with the rules given below for the formation of derivatives and compounds, are considered radicals of the Neutral Language, even if they are derivatives in the national languages, e. g. **dialekt** dialect, **doktor** doctor, **eksempl** example, **optimist** optimist, **original** original, **perpendikular** perpendicular. (r. 25).

§ 75. A root remains **always unchanged**; prefixes and suffixes may be added to it, or a second radical may be joined with it. (r. 26).

§ 76. Radicals can belong to **all the parts of speech**, e. g. **tabl** table, **grand** great, **tri** three, **mie** my, [mi] **am** [1] love, **ergo** therefore, **de** of, **If** if, **fl** fie. (r. 12).

§ 77. There are radicals of one, two, three, four, and even (in a few instances) five syllables. e. g. **verb** verb, **tortur** torture, **mineral** mineral, **temperatur** temperature, **perpendikular** perpendicular. (r. 1, 2, 21).

§ 78. Roots may begin with a vowel, e. g. **adres** address, **amar** to love, and end in a vowel, e. g. **akua** water, **lingu** language, **kontinuar** to continue, **pronunsiar** to pronounce, **fluar** to flow, **vaku** empty. (r. 18, 19).

§ 79. Two, three, and even four consecutive consonants may stand at the beginning and in the middle of a word, if such spelling is found in English, French and German, e. g. **katastrof** catastrophe, **magistrat** magistracy, **monstrar** to show, **obskur** obscure, **splendar** to shine. (r. 22).

(b) DERIVATIVES.

Derivatives are formed by the addition of prefixes or suffixes to the root.

§ 80. Prefixes. (r. 99, 124, 125, 129, 134, 141).

1. **anti-** corresponds to the preposition **kontr** against : *antialkoholik* antialcoholic ; *antipap* antipope.
2. **arki-** signifies precedence, superiority : *arkiangel* archangel ; *arkiepiskop* archbishop.
3. **auto-** signifies self, auto- : *autobiografi* autobiography.
4. **dis-** signifies a separating, a parting, a sundering : *disfrangar* to break to pieces ; *diskupar* to cut up.
5. **ekui-** signifies equality : *ekuikrurik* isosceles ; *ekuivalar* to be equivalent.
6. **elektro-** signifies electricity : *elektroteknik* electrotechnics.
7. **foto-** signifies light : *foto-grafar* to photograph.
8. **gala-** signifies magnificence or pomp : *galadine* state-dinner ; *galavest* gala dress (attire).
9. **hidro-** signifies water : *hidrodens* water-tight.
10. **homo-** signifies proportionateness : *homoton* consonance.
11. **kali-** signifies beauty : *kali-graf* calligrapher.

These prefixes may be appended to all radicals, in so far as the sense allows it.

§ 81. SUFFIXES.

Besides the suffixes given above in the discussion of the various parts of speech, the Neutral Language has the following :

- ad** ; this suffix has no fixed meaning and forms substantives having some reference to the root ; it is used also for the formation of substantives that denote the result of an action ; e. g. **bene-fasiad** benefit ; **edad** food ; **fontad** spring ; **garantad** guarantee, surety ; **Intrad** entrance ; **kampestrad** country (not city) ; **kandelad** candlestick ; **kavalkad** cavalcade ; **konosad** knowledge ; **limonad** lemonade ; **mediad** middle ; **merkantad** merchandise ; **piktad** painting, picture ; **platad** dish ; **preferad** preference ; **promenad** promenade ; **skribad** writing ; — **ganiad** earnings ; **kaptad** capture, catch, booty ; **pensad** thought ; **rostad** roast ; **skrlbad** writing, treatise, essay. (r. 70, 93).
- aj** forms collective nouns signifying things : **foliaj** foliage ; **linaj** linen (washing) ; **montaj** mountain range ; **ekipaž** equipage (e. g. horse and carriage) ; **plumaj** plumage. (r. 104, 110, 127)

- asjon** with a verbal root forms substantives denoting action : **deklinasjon** declension ; **preparation** preparation. (r. 53).
- ativ** with a verbal root forms adjectives expressing a capability or possibility : **purgativ** purgative. (r. 130).
- ator** with a verbal root forms substantives denoting a person or thing acting : **orator** orator ; **salvator** savior ; **ventillator** ventilator ; **numrator** numerator. (r. 54).
- el** forms collective nouns signifying persons : **parentel** kindred, relations, relatives ; **klientel** clients, customers, clientele. (r. 105).
- er** with a non-verbal root forms substantives denoting persons or things having some reference to the root, and for which the suffix **-ist** (see below), according to its special signification, is not suitable : **aksioner** stockholder ; **millioner** millionaire ; **senater** senator ; **tabler** cabinet-maker, joiner ; **pinser** eye-glasses, pince-nez. (r. 28, 138).
- eri** forms substantives denoting place : **taneri** tannery ; **apleri** beehive ; **restaureri** restaurant ; **kaferi** coffee-house, café ; **blireri** beer-house, ale-house. (r. 106).
- esk[ar]** forms verbs denoting to become, to grow, to begin : **verdeskar** to become green ; **putreskar** to putrefy ; **palldeskar** to become pale ; **saneskar** to recover, to convalesce. (r. 51).
- graf** forms substantives that denote persons who write, draw, etc., in a certain way : **foto-graf** photographer. (r. 131).
- ia** forms substantives that denote a country : **Espania** Spain ; **Rusia** Russia ; **Italia** Italy ; **patria** fatherland, native country. (r. 30).
- ifik[ar]** forms verbs denoting that something specified in the root is made : **grandifikar** to make large ; **falsifikar** to falsify ; **simplifikar** to simplify. (r. 52).
- ism** forms substantives denoting a religion or a mental disposition : **protestantism** Protestantism ; **realism** realism ; **kosmopolitism** cosmopolitanism ; **partikularism** particularism. (r. 48, 140).
- ist** with a non-verbal root forms substantives denoting persons who apply themselves to something, occupy themselves with something : **velosipedist** velocipedist ; **drogist** druggist ; **telegrafist** telegrapher, telegraphist. (r. 29, 140).
- itet** with an adjective forms substantives denoting a quality : **egalitet** equality ; **amabilitet** amiability ; **kualitet** quality ; **raritet** rareness, rarity ; **totalitet** totality. (r. 27).

- metr** forms substantives denoting a person or thing measuring something : *termo-metr* thermometer ; *horometr* clock. (r. 102).
- on** forms substantives that denote an enlargement : *rastron* harrow. (r. 101).
- or** forms substantives denoting the state or affection of a person or thing acting, e. g. **amor** love ; **ardor** ardor ; **eror** error. (r. 136).

All these suffixes may be employed in the formation of new words, and in accordance with the rules given above, by anyone using the language ; the suffix **-ad** is, however, excepted ; the Academy reserves to itself the formation of new words in which this suffix appears, on account of its indeterminate meaning. (r. 70).

(c) COMPOUND WORDS.

§ 82. Compound words, that is, words containing two roots, may be formed from all the parts of speech with the exception of the cardinal numbers (see below), if the sense allows it, by simple juxtaposition, with a hyphen or (usually) without it ; the determining (or modifying) word precedes the determined, e. g. **post-mark** postage stamp ; **grand-patr** grandfather ; **dupl-akull** double eagle ; **omni-potent** omnipotent ; **bene-faslar** to benefit ; **eks-posar** to expose, to exhibit.—Instead of cardinal numbers special prefixes are used, the principal of which are the following : 1 **mono-**, 2 **bi-**, 3 **tri-**, 4 **kuadri-**, 5 **penta-**, 6 **heksa-**, 7 **hepta-**, 8 **okto-**, 9 **nona-**, 10 **deka-**, 100 **hekto-**, and 1,000 **kilo-**, e. g. **monookulik** one-eyed ; **bikavalik** two-horse ; **pentaangul** pentagon. (r. 86).

§ 83. REMARK. As the most common prefixes and suffixes taken from the natural languages have been chosen, the most of the artificially formed words correspond fully to the natural words with the same meaning ; e. g. **preskribar**, **prototip**, **kavalkad'**, **deklinasjon**, **ventillator**, **millioner**, **patria**, **falsifikar**, **realism**, **drogist**, **kualitet** are formed according to the rules of the Neutral Language, and yet they are perfectly international words. Often, however, the natural words that have become international are not identical with the regularly formed, artificial words, e. g. **visibl**—**visabl** visible ; **egualisar**—**egualifikar** to equalize ; **anual**—**anuik** annual ; **infektion**—**infektasjon** infection. Such international words are placed in the dictionary (in the orthography of Idiom neutral) in parentheses immediately after the regularly formed, artificial word of the same meaning. It is allowed to use at will either form. (r. 56.)

§ 84. The following abbreviations are used in the Neutral Language (r. 137) :



APPENDIX

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE INTERNATIONAL ACADEMY OF THE UNIVERSAL LANGUAGE.

[This History and the preceding Grammar, written by Mr. Woldemar Rosenberger, Vice-director of the Academy, were, with his permission, translated by me for this work from the original German.—M. A. F. H.]

The International Academy of the Universal Language owes its origin to three congresses, which were held by Volapükists. The first congress of the Volapük union, to which the inventor of Volapük, Rev. J. M. Schleyer, in his "Weltspracheblatt (Volapükabled)"⁽¹⁾ had invited "all friends, well-wishers and knowers of Volapük," took place in Friedrichshafen on Lake Constance from the 25th to the 28th of August, 1884. At this congress there were present Volapükists from Germany, Austria and Alsace; German was the language used;⁽²⁾ no decisions of importance were arrived at—at least none were made public—but a committee was chosen, which was commissioned to prepare for a second congress to be held at a fitting time and place,⁽³⁾ and this committee at the beginning of 1887, in Schleyer's Volapükabled and in Cogabled, issued an invitation to all Volapükists of the world to attend an international congress to be held in Munich from the 6th to the 9th of August, 1887.⁽⁴⁾

In this congress of Munich (1) some immaterial grammatical questions were decided; (2) statutes were prepared for a general international world-language club, which, however, came to nought; (1) and (3) in order to preserve the unity of the language and to perfect Volapük, an international society called the International Academy of the Universal Language was founded, which should begin its work the 1st of January, 1888. (2) Prof. Dr. Auguste Kerckhoffs of Paris, secretary of the extraordinarily active "Association française pour la propagation du Volapük" and author of the French Volapük Dictionary, (3) into which he had introduced some simplifications of the language, was unanimously chosen Director of the Academy, and seventeen persons from twelve different countries were chosen as kademals, that is academicians or members of the Academy. (4)

In § 9 of the resolutions of the congress that relate to the founding of the Academy, it is said that the Academy itself should formulate its own statutes, as a basis for which the statutes proposed by Schleyer⁽⁵⁾ and all applicable paragraphs of the statutes of the "Académie française" should be used. After their ratification by the *cifal* (Director general: an honorary position created for Schleyer), the statutes should be communicated to the congress (perhaps a future one is intended). In § 8 of the same resolutions it was provided that a congress of the Academy should be held every third year at the beginning of August, that is at the same time with the congress of the above-mentioned general world-language club.⁽⁶⁾ Paris or Vienna was chosen as the place of the next congress.⁽⁷⁾

Professor Kerckhoffs had accepted his election as Director on the following two conditions: (1) that the resolutions [he erroneously calls them statutes] of the Munich congress relative to the Academy be considered as provisional and be submitted to a new examination at the coming Volapük congress in the year 1889, on the occasion of the great Paris Exposition; (2) that, besides the above-mentioned seventeen persons, seven other gentlemen proposed by him be accepted as academicians.⁽¹⁾ The seventeen academicians already chosen and Schleyer also assented to these conditions.⁽²⁾ Thus the future congress had a perfect right to ratify statutes, and the question as to the time and place of the next congress was also decided—Paris, 1889.

The work of the Academy now began, and Schleyer was the first to propose certain questions to the Academy; among others this: Should every root without exception begin with a consonant?⁽³⁾

The Director of the Academy in his correspondence with its members made use of "Le Volapük," a journal edited by himself, and first of all laid down the following programme for the labors of the Academy: I. Alphabet: (a) sounds, (b) letters. II. Formation of Words: (a) roots, (b) derivatives, (c) compounds. III. Arrangement of Words. IV. Grammar: (a) declension, (b) conjugation, (c) use and signification of prepositions, adverbs, etc. V. Examination of improperly formed words of the Dictionary. VI. Proposing of new words.⁽⁴⁾

After this programme had been approved by the Academy, he entered upon the work proper and began with the question, whether the sounds *ä ö ü* should be admitted into the language or not and, in the former event, whether they should be rendered by the forms *ä ö ü* or otherwise.

From these questions on the part of Schleyer and of the Director it is perceived that the Academy had to decide not only a

few unimportant questions, such as had been hitherto raised by Volapükists, but that radical changes in the language were imminent and that great and earnest work was demanded of the Academy; for, if the majority had answered the above two questions in the negative, all dictionaries and textbooks of Volapük would immediately have become useless, and for half the Volapük words and for many grammatical forms the Academy would have had to create new words and forms, so that an entirely new language would have arisen, for which even the name Volapük would no longer have been suitable. It may be noted in passing that the answers were such that no radical changes were immediately necessary.

Thereupon the Director, in accordance with his programme, proposed other questions to the Academy and, after the answers of the individual academicians had been received, compared them, and the opinion of the majority formed a resolution of the Academy. Such resolutions were published in the journal "Le Volapük." In proposing questions and in announcing the result the Director made use of Volapük.

At first the Academy had labored very diligently, so that at the beginning of the year 1889 the following had been resolved: what sounds were allowable in the language, by what letters they should be represented, the accentuation of words, and some principles for the formation of words; the two leading principles for the selection of roots were as follows: (1) it is allowed to choose roots at will, but when possible, short roots existing in the natural languages should be preferred, (2) it is not necessary to retain the original form of the root, but that form which is nearest the original is the best.—Further, it had been resolved that the order of words in the sentence should not be optional, but should take place in accordance with simple, fixed rules and, as for declension, *that both kinds of declension (if I may so express myself) should be permitted—by means of the endings -a, -e, -i and with preposi-*

tions—*de* for the genitive and *al* for the dative.—Resolutions in regard to conjugation and the form of pronouns were, however, still lacking; neither had the Academy yet entered upon the examination of improperly formed words nor the proposing of new words. Thus the programme was not yet fully elaborated, and consequently the Director could not carry into effect his intention of submitting to the congress of August, 1889, a finished grammatical project for final ratification; he therefore published shortly before the congress a grammatical project, in which these important points (conjugation and pronouns) were not drawn up in accordance with resolutions of the Academy, but contained some of the Director's proposed changes, which were still waiting ratification.⁽¹⁾ As, however, these proposed changes did not meet with the general approbation of the Academy, there could not be question of a ratification by the congress of the proposed grammatical project; even the discussion of questions of grammar in the congress proved impossible, for it would have led to debates taking up much time, and would have accomplished no practical result; therefore the congress contented itself with entrusting to the Academy the preparation of a simple grammar.⁽²⁾

The congress was held in Paris August 19-21, 1889, and was participated in by Volapükists from thirteen different countries: France, Germany, Belgium, Italy, England, Spain, Russia, Denmark, Austria-Hungary, Greece, United States of America, Turkey and China. The language of the congress was Volapük.—The principal work of the congress consisted in a detailed examination of all the twenty-one paragraphs of the statutes of the International Academy of the Universal Language, which the preparatory committee appointed by Professor Kerckhoffs had elaborated, and in the ratification of these (after some changes) in the form in which they are here given (see below) in an English translation.

They are still in force to-day ; in § 1 it is expressly stated that the task of the Academy is to complete and improve the grammar and dictionary of the inventor.—According to the last paragraph these statutes can be changed only by an international congress. In relation to congresses of the Universal Language the resolution of the 20th of August runs as follows : “The Academy must decide where and when the next congress should be held ; the Academy should form the preparatory committee for the congress.”⁽¹⁾

Schleyer, who had not been present at the congress, announced that he ratified all paragraphs of the statutes with the exception of those which determined his rights in the Academy, and that he reserved to himself a veto in all cases.⁽²⁾ As no right of ratification had been granted to Schleyer by the congress, no attention was paid to this claim.

Thus the International Academy of the Universal Language had become a viable, self-existent institution, whose given right and imposed duty were : (1) to complete the grammar and dictionary of the inventor, and (2) to introduce unlimited changes in them as soon as such should be considered improvements by the Academy.

Although therefore there was every prospect that the work of the Academy, begun with such success, would be finished in accordance with the programme, it must unfortunately be stated that after the congress there was a diminution of energy in the prosecution of the work, and that it was even brought to a temporary standstill. The fault first of all lay in this, that the Director changed the manner of proposing questions, since he (1) no longer proposed to the Academy single parts of the grammar to be voted on, but a complete grammatical project at one time, and with further proposed changes, and (2) directed the academicians to come to an agreement as to the acceptance or non-acceptance of this grammar with the clubs of the countries which they repre-

sented,—a method of voting not provided for in the statutes.⁽¹⁾ It was not possible to arrive at an agreement in this way, and if the views of the different Volapük clubs and journals and their correspondents were already, even before this, widely divergent, the strife of parties was increased by this action, and in a short time instead of one grammatical project there were many, for many of the academicians had laid their votes before the Director in the form of independent grammatical projects, and some of them had also published their projects.—It can not be denied that many of these grammatical projects contained good proposals that deserved to be taken into consideration by the Academy; therefore it was the general wish that the Director would submit the various proposals to a vote of the Academy in the journal of the Academy, which he meanwhile had founded under the name of "Calabled Kadema" (official paper of the Academy) [of which, however, only two numbers appeared]. The Director had the floor, so to speak, and the whole Volapük world waited expectantly for what would now come from Paris. Professor Kerckhoffs, however, for many months remained silent.—This circumstance and the disagreement of Volapükists had for result, that interest in Volapük ceased rather suddenly, and the ardent propaganda from this time onward constantly declined.

In order again to put in motion the interrupted work of the Academy, in November, 1890, at the instance of the St. Petersburg Volapük Club (*Zilak volapüköl*), a petition signed by twenty-three academicians and nineteen other Volapükists was sent to the Director with the request that he would submit to the Academy the nine leading grammatical projects (of academicians Day and Holden, Guigues, Heyligers, Kerckhoffs, Knuth, Krüger, Lederer and von Rylski,⁽²⁾ Plum,⁽³⁾ Rosenberger) grouped in separate

paragraphs, beginning with the most important, in order that the Academy might choose from the proposed forms in each individual instance those that were desired. This request was not complied with, although § 17 of the statutes says that every proposal signed by at least six members of the Academy must be brought before the Academy; but instead of this there appeared once more, in the second number of the academic paper, of date December, 1890, a complete grammatical project with a very inaccurate account of the proposals made by the academicians, and by a circular of July 20, 1891, Professor Kerckhoffs conveyed the intelligence that he had determined to lay down his office.

Thereupon the Academy commissioned a provisional committee, consisting of Champ-Rigot, Guigues and Heyligers, three members of the Academy living in Paris, to bring about the election of a new Director.

This committee reported its work in its six circulars to the members of the Academy of November 2, 1891 to December 14, 1892. The committee issued a financial report, had a so-called normal grammar (*Glamat nomik*) printed, which was written in Volapük, in which are given all the rules in the form in which they had been accepted by the Academy, and by vote of the academicians brought about the election of several new members of the Academy and finally of the Director, whereby it was my lot to receive the honor of an election to this office for five years. Since one of the members of the committee, H. Heyligers, by a circular to the academicians of date January 15, 1893, announced that he knew nothing of the election of a new Director, as he had been present at no meeting of the committee for at least three months, it was decided by the Academy to submit the work of the committee, in so far as it concerned the election of a Director, to a revision; and this was entrusted to the Volapük club of Leitmeritz in Bohemia.⁽¹⁾

After making this examination the Leitmeritz club, by a circular to the academicians of date May 16, 1893, announced that I was actually the newly-elected Director.

Meanwhile the Academy had been inactive for nearly four years, interest in Volapük had materially diminished, Schleyer ignored the greater changes, the number of members of the Academy had decreased to fifteen and of Volapük papers to three, most of the Volapük clubs had ceased their activity, and the few remaining Volapükists were hostile to each other : some held to Schleyer and his Volapük, others regarded Volapük with Kerckhoffs's changes as the ideal of an international language, the rest broke up into a number of smaller groups, each of which defended one of the many linguistic systems that arose at that period. —In spite of these conditions, so unfavorable for the labors of the Academy, convinced of the adaptability of an artificial language to international intercourse, and trusting in the feasibility of the task of the Academy and in the serviceableness of the statutes elaborated at Paris, I ventured to take up the interrupted work.

In the first place I left the grammar entirely alone and began with the most important part of the work—the examination of improperly formed words and the proposing of new words. —First I laid before the Academy for examination a list of such Volapük words as I was persuaded needed no change, e. g. *delfin*, *legion*, *metal*, etc., since they appear in most European languages, and in this I had noted after each word in what languages the word may be found (the following seven languages were always kept in view: English, French, German, Spanish, Italian, Russian and Latin). In the second list, instead of the corresponding Volapük words, I proposed to the Academy to accept such words as by their form fitted perfectly into the Volapük system, that is began and ended with a consonant, and could thus be taken into the dictionary without detriment to the Volapük grammar, and which complied with the above-mentioned resolution of the Academy—that the

original form of the word should be retained as far as possible—much better than the respective Volapük words, e. g. *fabrik*, manufactory instead of *fablüd*; *balsam*, balsam instead of *bain*; *trup*, troop instead of *llup*, etc. In this I met with very little opposition: most of the words proposed by me were accepted unanimously, and objection was made by individual academicians to only a few words, that is counter-proposals were made; for instance, I had proposed *frat*, brother instead of *blod*, for which academician Plum of Copenhagen considered *fratr* still more suitable. In such cases I brought the question once more before the Academy, that is I had the academicians choose between both the proposed words, and that word for which the most votes had been given was considered accepted according to § 13 of the statutes.

In my communications with the members of the Academy I did not make use of a periodical, as this had proved unsuitable, for each number of such must consist of a fixed number of pages and appear at a stated time; but what I had to say to the academicians I caused to be printed in the form of circulars of from one to twelve pages, just as they were needed, naturally in Volapük, and sent two copies to each academician with the request that in one of the copies he would record his vote on the questions proposed and return this copy signed to me as soon as possible; as to this last, the Academy had granted me the right to disregard all votes received later than sixty-five days after I sent out the respective questions. This long time was fixed upon to enable the Brazilian member of the Academy to take part in the work, and it was impossible for his vote to arrive in St. Petersburg at an earlier date.—All the questions were so worded that the academicians were obliged to answer by *yes* or *no*, so that I was able to count the votes for and against; but in case of new proposals, for instance of words or grammatical rules, I had requested that the academicians would never vote simply *no*, but, if anyone disagreed with the proposal, that he would make a better one; in which latter

case both proposals were laid before the Academy to choose from, as has already been pointed out in the above-cited example of *frat* and *fratr*. In this way, on the one hand, many really good and practical proposals came to light, which is most desirable in such work, and every proposal of every academician was put to the vote of the Academy; on the other hand opportunity was given to each member of the Academy to make his own proposals and to take part in the selection of a definite proposal from among several. Thence also contentment reigned among the members of the Academy, whose number by the accession of very capable persons began to increase.

At that time, as is mentioned above, besides Volapük several other systems of artificial language had appeared. I must here name the chief among them, as they had a material influence on the labors of the Academy:

1. *La lingvo internacia* by Dr. Esperanto (Zamenhof) of Warsaw.⁽¹⁾
2. *Kosmos* by Eugene A. Lauda of Berlin.⁽²⁾
3. *Spelin* by Professor J. Bauer of Agram.⁽³⁾
4. *Myrana* by J. Stempfli of Oberreute in Bavaria.⁽⁴⁾
5. *Lingua internazional* or *Mondolingu* by J. Lott of Vienna.⁽⁵⁾
6. *Universala* by Dr. Eugene Heintzeler, principal, of Stuttgart.⁽⁶⁾

7. Novilatin by Dr. E. Beermann, headmaster, of Nordhausen.⁽¹⁾

Besides these artificial languages the works of the following persons also influenced the Academy: Dr. T. C. Winkler of Haarlem,⁽²⁾ John Runström of Stockholm,⁽³⁾ editor Karl Lentze of Leipsic, ⁽⁴⁾ Edgar von Wahl of Reval and Anton von Grabovski of Ivano-Vosnesensk, the accentuation of words adopted by the Academy, namely on the vowel preceding the last consonant, being a proposal of Bauer (in Spelin) and Wahl, ⁽⁵⁾ and the plural ending -i, a proposal of Zamenhof⁽⁶⁾ and Grabovski.⁽⁷⁾ If the language of Dr. Esperanto was the best work in practical execution, on the other hand the best theoretical directions for creating an international language had been given by J. Stempfl. With the probable exception of Prof. Bauer, all the above-cited authors agreed in this, that the roots of words must be taken from living languages or from the Latin, and with as little change as possible.

Of the greatest importance to the labors of the Academy was the work of Dr. Alberto Liptay, "Eine Gemeinsprache der Kulturvölker," which appeared in 1891, in which the author instituted a critical inquiry into the projects of universal language that had appeared up to that time, and laid down fixed principles for the building up of a dictionary of an international language, but did not himself proceed to the execution of this work. He then pointed out that there already exists a large number of so-called world-words, e. g. *animal*, which is intelligible to nearly all nations and certainly to all civilized peoples, even to those who do not, as

the English, the French, the Italians, the Spanish, the Portuguese, etc., use it as a vocable of their mother-tongue ; thus the German speaks of *Animalismus*, *Animalien*, *animalisieren*, and of *animalischen Eigenschaften*.⁽¹⁾ Further examples of such world-words were : *artificial*, *universal*, *amor*, *color*, *baron*, *balkon*, *amen*, *volumen*, *merkantil*, *vulcan*, *fabricant*, *miserable*, *natur*, *divin*, *adyectiv*, *observatorium*, *celibat*, *evangelist*, *tabak*, *cigar*, *kafé*, *té*, *sport*, *club*, *astronom*, *logaritm*, etc.—in all over 8,000 words.⁽²⁾—All these words are entitled to admission to the dictionary of a language intended for international use, just as are the elements of which these words are composed,—only they must be discovered and collected⁽³⁾—indeed Liptay lays down the proposition that a universal language must not be invented, but discovered.⁽⁴⁾ Convinced of the impossibility of creating a universal language, Liptay proposed the attaining of a common language by way of synthesis or compilation of such elements as are already within the reach of every human understanding and only await condensation into something tangible or visible and to be brought into a homogeneous form.⁽⁵⁾—As to the manner of writing the world-words we find in the same work directions most worthy of notice;⁽⁶⁾ what Liptay most exhaustively says as to the international value of single letters can be denied in only a few instances.

After the work of Dr. Liptay had been submitted to Professor Max Müller of Oxford, he expressed his opinion to the author in the following terms : “ Your idea of choosing roots almost universally understood by men of education is excellent, and the grammatical articulation that you propose is very practicable, although here and there perhaps something simpler and more practical could be suggested. What you have to do now is to elaborate a complete

dictionary."⁽¹⁾—It appears that Dr. Liptay has not followed Max Müller's advice, for no dictionary by him has yet appeared.

The International Academy of the Universal Language, however, willingly followed these practical suggestions. After I had called the attention of the Academy to the above-cited works on universal language in general and to that of Liptay in particular, and had invited the members to take them into consideration in voting, in order that the Academy might not be behind in the general movement, the leading principles of orthography were soon settled, and then the resolution was passed that for every root the international form must be sought, that is, that that root is the best which appears in the most European languages.⁽²⁾ In fulfilment of this resolution, I considered in the selection of words to be proposed the seven leading languages of Europe, as above mentioned, and after I had assured myself that still more suitable forms had not been found by the above-mentioned writers, Esperanto, Lott, Heintzeler and Beermann, I laid my proposals before the Academy to be voted upon.

As, contrary to what had heretofore been held, the dictionary and not the grammar was considered the more important, and as very many international roots begin with a vowel, I necessarily proposed such roots, although the forms of the Volapük grammar are very unsuitable for such roots; on the other hand I had to seek new grammatical forms that would suit these roots.—After much search and many trials simple forms were found, e. g. the verbal suffixes *-av* for the past and *-ero* for the future, which, borrowed from the natural languages, are as well known to educated Europeans as the artificial Volapük forms; wherefore they also, with slight changes, were accepted by the Academy. It was also possible to replace most of the arbitrarily invented

Volapük prefixes and suffixes by more natural forms, and in many cases even by international ones.⁽¹⁾ Most of the proposed words were accepted by the Academy, and in case counter-proposals were made, I proceeded as I pointed out above.

When the five years of my directorship were at an end, the programme of the work in essentials had been carried out ; the Academy had accepted :

- (1) rules for orthography and pronunciation,
- (2) about 3,000 of the most necessary roots,
- (3) the most necessary prefixes and suffixes,
- (4) a large number of derivatives and compounds,
- (5) all the pronouns,
- (6) the most commonly used adverbs, prepositions, and conjunctions,
- (7) all the grammatical forms,
- (8) rules for the order of words in the sentence.

The sum of the then-existent resolutions of the Academy could already be rightly called an artificial language. This academic language is essentially distinguished from all other artificial languages in this, that it is not the work of one man, but is the result of years of toil on the part of a whole international society. On the one hand, it can be just as easily spoken and written as Volapük, for the Volapük principles—of an almost phonetic spelling, of no exception to given rules, and of the simplicity and ease with which derivatives can be formed from roots⁽²⁾—have been retained ; but on the other hand, this language is much more easily understood both by hearers and readers than Volapük, since, for all the elements of which the words are composed, such forms were chosen as are already known to the majority of educated

Europeans.—Several members of the Academy already used the new language instead of Volapük for correspondence with their colleagues, since they found that it is much easier to write in the academic language than in Volapük, although the resolutions of the Academy had not yet been brought into a form available for ready reference, and although there was no grammar in which the accepted forms were collected, nor a dictionary where the accepted words could be found in alphabetical order.

I having declined a re-election,⁽¹⁾ from the persons proposed as Director of the Academy, on the 16th of May, 1898, Rev. M. A. F. Holmes, member of the Academy, resident in Macedon, New York, was unanimously elected for the term of five years.⁽²⁾

The circulars of the new Director to the academicians no longer appeared in Volapük, but in the new academic language, to which the name Neutral Language (Idiom neutral) was soon given by the Academy.

The new Director continued the work of the Academy in the same spirit : the language was further enlarged both by changes of some things previously accepted, but which had proved unsuitable, and by the acceptance of a large number of new roots and new derivatives and compounds, and partly by means of several new prefixes and suffixes.

The language is now so far finished that it can be practically useful, and therefore it is time to publish in the form of grammar and dictionary, as here presented, the resolutions so far passed by the Academy.

The work of the Academy, however, is not ended, nor will it ever altogether cease, for the Neutral Language, as every living language, will be subject to constant growth, and accordingly the Academy will be obliged continually to add to the dictionary.

The Academy has granted me a concession to publish the German dictionary of the Neutral Language, and a similar concession for the English dictionary to Rev. Director Holmes.

Should the foregoing dictionary by its practical use in life serve to facilitate international intercourse, its task is accomplished. I consider it an agreeable duty on this occasion to express my most obliged thanks to the Director, Rev. M. A. F. Holmes, for all the friendly services which he has so kindly rendered to me during the preparation of this book.

Since the above was written the German grammar and dictionary of the Neutral Language have appeared,⁽¹⁾ and there are already many indications that Idiom Neutral is destined to become in the near future the medium of international intercommunication. Several reviews have spoken in the highest terms of the language, and *Le Nouveau Précurseur*, of Antwerp, Belgium, already publishes a biweekly letter, written in the Neutral Language, from a correspondent in Russia.

A concession has been granted by the Academy to W. V. Bonto van Bylevelt, one of the academicians for Holland, to publish the Dutch grammar and dictionary of the language.

I take the present opportunity of testifying to the many helpful suggestions received from Mr. W. Rosenberger, Vice-director of the Academy; all which have tended to the betterment of this book.

STATUTES

O F T H E

INTERNATIONAL ACADEMY OF THE UNIVERSAL LANGUAGE

Enacted 19—21 August, 1889, by the International Congress of
Volapükists in Paris.

[Translated from the Volapük original by M. A. F. Holmes.]

1. The Academy busies itself only with the completion and improvement of the grammar and dictionary of the inventor.
2. The Academy is the sole authority in questions of language.
3. Academicians are chosen from among the most eminent of those who know the universal language in the different countries of the earth.
4. In each country an academician may be chosen for every ten million inhabitants; a fraction of ten million is counted as ten million.
5. Each country will have its normal number of academicians only when the universal language will have been sufficiently propagated therein.
6. This number may be increased exceptionally in favor of very meritorious persons.
7. The election of academicians takes place on proposal by the director and by a majority of the voters.
8. The director of the Academy must propose for the office of academician those persons who are proposed to him by the clubs of the respective countries.
9. If the clubs propose no person within two months, or if there be no club, the candidate is selected by the director.
10. Academicians are chosen for five years; re-election is allowed.
11. The Academy is administered by a directorate consisting

of : (a) the inventor, (b) the director, (c) the vice-director, (d) two secretaries

12. The director and the vice-director are elected by the academicians for five years. They may be re-elected. The secretaries are appointed by the director.

13. A mere majority of the voters decides.

14. If the number of votes for and against is equal, the vote of the director decides.

15. The resolutions of the Academy must be laid before the inventor at once. If the inventor does not protest against the resolutions within thirty days, the resolutions are definitive. Those resolutions which are not approved by the inventor will again be laid before the Academy, and will become definitive only after they will have been accepted by a two-thirds majority.

16. The resolutions of the Academy are published in the universal language in the official journal of the Academy, which is chosen by the Academy.

17. The director must lay before the Academy every proposal that is signed by six academicians.

18. An academician who refuses to obey the definitive resolutions of the majority, or who for a year and without just cause has refused to take part in the labors of the Academy, has ceased to be an academician. The director should propose his dismissal.

19. The dismissal of an academician is resolved by a two-thirds majority of the voters.

20. Every academician pays a contribution of ten francs a year until the Academy will have the necessary means. The directorate of the Academy resolves how this money will be used. One of the secretaries is cashier of the Academy.

21. These statutes can be changed only by an international congress.

The original is signed by Paul Champ-Rigot, secretary of the congress.
